As I read it, the committee's charge is to examine only re-designation, but presumably not elimination, of sports. This would of course free up more recruiting slots for the 25 or so remaining varsity sports, but I wonder whether continuing to operate all of the re-designated sports, even in a club format, would free up enough financial resources to make a difference to the competitiveness of the remaining varsity sports? I recognize that this is complicated by the fact that endowment restricted to individual sports is not fungible, but it would be a shame to go through all of this and not move the needle.
