Jack.

Thank you for reaching out. This coming fall, we will have 27 players on our roster. Ideally, our roster would be at 31. The D1 roster limit is 35 (and will be higher for many schools this year, potentially coming years as well depending upon the NCAA's response to roster proposals).

Proposed 31-Man Roster

- 16 position players (3 C, 1 1B, 6 INF, 6 OF)
- 15 pitchers (4 Starters, 6 Long Relievers, 4 Short Relievers, 1 Closer)
- Provides valuable positional depth, and allows for traditional scrimmages and practices. Gives more depth for pitching as well, which is the position in baseball most vulnerable to injury. Myriad variables surrounding our sport have led to more injuries (the increase in games played in high school and youth baseball, showcase/travel baseball, increased physicality in pitchers leading to higher velocity before the player's frame/body can sustain or support that explosiveness) making it important to have increased pitching depth.

Impacts of a 27-Man Roster

- 14 position players (3 C, 1 1B, 6 INF, 4 OF)
- 13 pitchers (4 Starters, 4 Long Relievers, 4 Short Relievers, 1 Closer)
- Practices are forced to be non-traditional (3-team scrimmages to fill defensive positioning). This drastically limits development for all players in the team setting, an area where we have seen deficiencies over the past few years.
- Injuries of any kind can be debilitating (we have traveled injured players to lvy competitions because we did not have enough players who were healthy to meet the 24-man travel squad).
- Freshmen are required to play, often before they are ready. This sets them back in both confidence and development.
- There is limited positional depth to hold players accountable without making a mockery of the on-field product (putting a player in the game that is not suited for competition in that position).

<u>Baseball</u> - 27 players, 10 play at a time, 0 free substitutions. Depending on the number of pitches thrown, a pitcher may need 2-6 days between outings - rendering them medically incapable of playing back-to-back games.

Peer Comparison

The Division I roster limit for baseball is 35 players, and our roster is allowed to be 80% of that roster. Of the teams that finished above us in the standings in 2019, all had at least 31 players on their roster during ly competition. Historically, Princeton and Yale are the only schools that waiver around 29-30 players on their rosters, while most others have been between 32-35. I came to these numbers based on checking website rosters, observing uniformed players in the dugout when we are the visiting team, and talking with the other coaches.

While extensive, hopefully this provides background on how I arrived at that specific number.

Jack,

The ideal Men's Soccer roster would be 28 players. This is an additional two players to our current roster. To play a full field game against ourselves for training you need 22 players. That leaves six extra places for a 3rd/4th goalkeeper(s) and substitutes. Injuries have placed a toll on our current 26 man roster the last few years. Using 2019 as an example we had two of our 26 players out for the entire season before we started preseason(Will Crain and Jack Hagstrom) effectively reducing us to a 24 man roster with 21 field players and three Goalkeepers. This limits/eliminates the opportunity to play full sided(11v11) in training especially when we get into the season as classes, injuries, and illness take away players each week.

In the lvy League the smallest roster besides Brown has been Harvard. Harvard over the last five seasons has at their max a roster of 29 players and at their least a roster of 25 players. Columbia has a 28 player roster cap. Cornell, Dartmouth, Penn, Princeton, and Yale have all seen rosters of 30 players or more in the last four years. In the last four years Dartmouth, Princeton, and Yale have won the lvy League

Jack,

Attached are my proposed ideal roster sizes. They are in line with our average rosters over the past 5 years. The proposed numbers are higher than our 2019-20 numbers because we had an unusual amount of attrition and we because we rolled over a number of support slots to this year's recruiting class. Next year, we will be back in line with our usual averages as we have a large recruiting class coming in.

The proposed men's roster size is 5 less than the Ivy League Average, but this represents our low number of support spots on the men's side. I don't know that it is feasible to get above 50 with 11 slots per year, and I doubt we can be competitive under 50. None of the teams in the top half of the league have roster sizes under 50.

The women's number is in line with the lvy League average.


