#### A Note From Founding Partner Ben Bailey

Bailey & Glasser had an amazing year in 2022. Reviewing the highlights of our work only scratches the surface. But here are some examples, with apologies for all the others I don't have room to include –

On the national trial stage, our lawyers took Monsanto and its Roundup product to trial in St. Louis, which settled handsomely four days into the trial for our plaintiff client. In bankruptcy court in Indiana, representing veterans whose hearing was damaged by earplugs manufactured by 3M, we helped defeat 3M's efforts to enjoin prosecution of 230,000 of these cases. We also played a lead role in a trial in New Jersey for talcinjury plaintiffs, challenging efforts by Johnson & Johnson to bankrupt and restructure its subsidiary LTL, using the now-notorious "Texas Two-Step" to avoid trials and move the individual injury cases into bankruptcy court. I am delighted to report that just this week (on Monday, January 23, 2023), the federal Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit agreed with the position we and our co-counsel took when we moved to get the bankruptcy dismissed, and entirely reversed the lower court decision. This appellate victory now allows all the plaintiffs harmed by J&J baby powder to take their cases to trial as guaranteed by the U.S. Constitution.

2022 was the year where we celebrated the 50th Anniversary of Title IX (the federal law prohibiting gender discrimination by educational institutions receiving federal funds), and our lawyers racked up success after success for female student-athletes at universities, including Brown and Dickinson. The same legal team secured the first Title IX victory ever for male student-athletes, preserving Clemson University's track team, and for female student-athletes there, too.

On the other side of the "V" (as in plaintiff v. defendant), we defended an employment discrimination case in a trial in Florida, where our lawyers and our client stuck to their guns and, on the eve of trial, flipped the cards by settling with the plaintiff and leaving our business client better off than it was before it was sued. In our home state of West Virginia, our trial lawyers – including one lawyer doing her very first trial, who walloped one witness and was so good that the trial judge couldn't believe it was her first – won a total victory in a case involving a natural gas lease.

Our business lawyers sometimes seem to have more fun than anyone. We helped the leading independent Christian movie studio raise monies and navigate the release of multiple movies in 2022 with more to come in 2023 (and we also won a trademark case for them, via summary judgment). We helped launch SI (Sports Illustrated) Tickets, an innovative new ticket purchasing platform – check out their app. We sold multiple businesses for clients, including an industrial scale company, as well as a satellite/earth station service provider to government and commercial customers, in both cases for long-term, classic entrepreneurial clients who are happy and will remain involved with the businesses they built for a transition period.

We've played a key role for a minority business client in efforts to acquire the Oakland Coliseum and a WNBA franchise in Oakland. And none of that includes all the estate planning, will drafting, and tax advice our business lawyers did in 2022.

We had other, more personal, successes that mean the world both to our individual clients and to our lawyers. For example, we represented a man – a dishwasher at a chain restaurant in West Virginia – who was waiting at a bus stop on his way to work when he was falsely accused of assault and battery on two police officers, then detained for nearly 45 days because he couldn't afford his bond. Dogged work by our lawyers turned up exonerating evidence the police had hidden or "lost," and a pattern of abuses within the city's police department worthy of a "60 Minutes" exposé. The result, ultimately, was a complete shakeup in the city's government and a settlement that means our client doesn't have to wash dishes anymore.

On the pro bono front, we helped a young woman from South America endure, and prevail, in a difficult disciplinary proceeding against a fellow student who had assaulted her. Additionally, we put together a lease, pro bono, for a formerly unhoused single mother to operate a coffee kiosk in the Washington Convention Center. And just before I put this note together, we got a call out of the blue from one of our clients, a class member in a pay-to-pay case. Her husband had been charged illegal mortgage servicing payments, and just passed away. She couldn't believe she had just gotten a check for \$2400 for her damages in that case, which will help her make ends meet at this difficult time.

These cases are why we practice law. All this work is done by a great, and growing, group of smart, nice people. We added thirty-eight employees in the last year, across all our offices. I think our folks added four new children to our ranks of dependents, with more little ones on the way.

We hope you'll enjoy this newsletter, and understand us a little bit better. Have a great 2023.



## BREAKING NEWS

On January 30, 2023, Bailey Glasser Won a Landmark Appellate Victory on Behalf of Consumers Originating From a February 2022 Trial



In a huge victory for individuals grievously harmed by Johnson & Johnson baby powder, the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit roundly rejected Johnson & Johnson's attempt to shovel all 38,000 cases into a brand-new subsidiary which then, within hours of creation, declared bankruptcy. In strong language, the federal appeals court found that the JNJ/LTL petition "has no valid bankruptcy purpose" and dismissed the bankruptcy in its entirety, reversing a ruling by a lower bankruptcy court.

The dismissal of the LTL bankruptcy now allows plaintiffs harmed by J&J's consumer products to continue pursuing justice before a jury trial of their peers, a right afforded them by the United States

Constitution.

Brian A. Glasser was co-lead counsel to the trial team vindicated by the appeals court. Brian stated in a news release: "J&J has no special right to put talc victims in a bankruptcy box. It now has to face these claims in front of juries around the nation."

## **2022 Litigation Highlights**

Bailey Glasser obtained a \$17 million jury verdict on behalf of our client, Mike Rodgers, who instead of receiving proper care for a spinal column injury, was rendered a paraplegic. Bailey Glasser partners **Greg Haddad** and **Sharon Iskra** tried the case over eight days in Charleston, West Virginia state court, in a matter that was heavily fought by the defendant who sought to avoid responsibility for his negligence.

Bailey Glasser Secures Jury Verdict on Behalf of Shonk Land Company



Bailey Glasser secured a unanimous jury verdict on behalf of Shonk Land Company in a matter that involved a breach of two oil & gas leases, tortious interference, intentional trespass, and unjust enrichment. Throughout the trial, the Bailey Glasser trial team of partner **Nick Johnson** and associate **Sallie Gilbert** proved that the defendants in this matter committed five separate breaches of Shonk's contractual rights of first refusal. In addition, we proved that one defendant, Diversified Gas & Oil Corporation, intentionally interfered with Shonk's Right of First Refusal by creating (and then lying about) an inflated property valuation that had no basis in fact.

BG took on Monsanto's Roundup weed killer, which is linked to the development of non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, seeking damages for these injuries and Monsanto's failure to warn of the product's cancer risk. BG's trial team consisted of Brian Glasser, David Selby, Jackie Olinger Rochelle, Christina Hutchins, Leslie Brueckner, and Todd Mathews, along with David Wool of Wool Trial Law, and Joan Lockwood and Tom Neill of Gray Ritter Graham. By the fourth day of trial, the case resolved. Brian Glasser said, "We are very happy to have brought this matter to a successful resolution for our client Nathaniel Evans and his family."





# BREAKING NEWS # Rhode Island Jury Awards \$4.8M in Compensatory Damages to Victim of Davol and C.R. Bard Hernia Mesh

In September 2022, a Rhode Island jury found Davol and C.R. Bard liable for injuries caused by their hernia mesh product, which our team argued caused side effects to the plaintiff such as chronic pain, infections, and nerve damage, and that the company sold the devices despite knowledge of their risk to patients. The jury awarded compensatory damages of \$4.8 million, plus interest, to our client Paul Trevino. BG's ESI team consisting of Partners Kate Charonko and Brian McAllister and associate Elizabeth Stryker, along with the trial team at Motley Rice, LLC, tried the case to verdict over the course of six weeks.



#### Title IX Turns 50

Title IX, a federal civil rights law passed in 1972, prohibits all educational institutions receiving federal funds from discriminating on the basis of sex. This includes almost all colleges and universities, public or private, and all public schools.

Bailey Glasser is a leading Title IX law firm in the United States. In 2022, we preserved women's gains in the landmark Brown University case, won a precedent-setting appeal against Michigan State University, and sued San Diego State University and the University of Central Oklahoma for violating Title IX. The law helped increase female participation by 614 percent at the college level and 1057 percent at the high school level.

Unfortunately, litigation is still essential because female student-athletes nationwide are being deprived of the equal opportunities to participate, athletic financial aid, and treatment the law requires. At Bailey Glasser, we continue the fight for true equality in sports.










# Congratulations Arthur Bryant!




#### National Law Journal Elite Trial Lawyers Awards
